The minister said there is no direct relationship between counterfeiting and high rate of alcohol consumption in Tamil Nadu. While combating alcohol, the minister said the state had introduced a policy to encourage production and export of fresh fruits and vegetables. "We have a policy of 'Chennai Call,' and for the first time fresh fruits and vegetables from Tamil Nadu will be exported to different parts of the world." He said the state was also encouraging the organic farming and farmers were able to earn a good income through cultivation of organic products. He also added that there were special programmes for supporting silk farmers and for the improvement of process. To provide better infra-structure to local youths, the state government had decided to set up a library cum cyber centre for the under-privileged youths. Minister of State for Home Affairs K. Pandiarajan said the state was also implementing three new projects under national flagship programmes for eradication of tuberculosis, Polio and Malaria. He said as part of the Polio eradication programme, 12 new drug and vaccine production units would be set up and samples for study and trials would be distributed to the state. While talking about Malaria eradication programme, Pandiarajan said a survey had been undertaken in 146 villages of the district. The officials claimed that 7 villages have shown improvement in malaria situation. The minister said the state government would set up a survey in one more area in the district. He said he was keen that the state should be ranked amongst top 10 states by next year. Chief Minister O. Panneerselvam and his deputy had given a presentation on the state's programmes at the first International Consumer Electronics Show in Hong Kong last week. He said the state's programs were for consumer electronics, IT, medical equipment and other sectors. Minister of State for Home Affairs K. Pandiarajan said the state had given preference to product whose quality was standardised, automated and involved minimum human intervention. He said the government would set up a network of kiosks through which low cost computer software, hardware and other products could be purchased.
